With a wheelchair it is necessary to use both the driver and aide to load and unload the wheelchair but you have discovered that 3 of your students have conflict and realize they should not be left unsupervised. While at the school you have requested assistance from the para that is in the bus lane. Their response is that "it isn't their job". What would be the best way to resolve this issue so the students are properly supervised and the wheelchair student is safely loaded and secured on the bus?

As a team – How would you respond to this situation? How would you communicate with campus staff to better resolve this issue? Would you have other resources or people you could turn to for guidance and resolution? What additional information or support would you need to make sure the routes are without conflict?
